

## Florida Board of Nursing APRN Supervisory Protocols

According to s.464.012(3),(4), Fla. Stat, non-autonomous APRNs, including CRNAs, must enter into supervisory protocols with a physician(s). That physician does not need to be a physician anesthesiologist.

Link to the Florida Board of Nursing's template to establish an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) supervisory protocol with a physician in Florida. The supervising physician is responsible for submitting a notice to the Florida Board of Medicine that they have entered into a supervisory relationship with a CRNA under HB453. In accordance with Florida Statute 464.012, a practicing CRNA must maintain their protocol onsite at their place of employment. The Florida Board of Nursing is no longer required to receive, review, or maintain APRN protocols.
